




# TO GO OR NOT TO GO

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# MAST BROTHERS CHOCOLATE




# THE GUGGENHEIM

Officially, this museum – which exists since 1959 – is called the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, named after its founder. Its beautiful building is by the American architect Frank Lloyd Wright and poses a nightmare for many curators: it was built in the shape of a spiral and there is little light. For this very reason, it is one of the most beautiful buildings in the city.

The collection consists of modern art and is mainly in the hands of the family Guggenheim.

You will find the museum on Fifth Avenue, between 88th and 89th Street.
